THE NEED

- 2020 prognosis: Denmark will lack 150 000 professionals with higher education
- 19 000 IT professionals lacking in DK by 2030
- 21% of companies hire unsuccessful recruits (61 000 as of Sep2019)





THE DEMAND

- Access to well-trained labor is the most important factor when attracting international companies
- Highly educated internationals are good for business



DANISH ECONOMY CONTRIBUTION

 Highly educated foreigner contributes 140 000kr per year to public finances

STUDENT RETENTION

 34% of international graduates from the universities' master programs are in employment in Denmark two years after graduation





POTENTIAL TO RETAIN MORE

- Many highly educated foreigners emigrate relatively quickly again:
- after 3 years, about a third have emigrated
- > after 6 years only about half are left
- after that the probability of emigration falls; after 10 years 40% foreigners continue to reside in Denmark.






STUDENTS JOBS AS KEY TO RETAIN

90% of international students working in jobs for more than 20 hours a week are employed in **Denmark** after graduation
